


Kinderlogo Extras

Tunes to Play on the Music Keyboard



The Music Keyboard activity in the Kinderlogo Extras section allows children to explore music. They can click on notes to hear them play, or use their letter names or numbers. Even though numbers 9 and 0 aren't visible on the keyboard, they will play notes that continue the scale on the keyboard (9 is for a High D, 0 is for a High E).

Activity Ideas for the Music Keyboard

On the next page are tunes that can be played with the 8 notes of the C Major scale.

You can print them out for students to try at their computers.

Telephone Music

Suggest that students hear what their telephone number sounds like. As noted above, they can type all the numbers from 1 through 0 across the top of the keyboard and hear the notes they play.

Do they like the tune that their phone number plays?

Can they invent words to go with it?

Can they invent a new phone number with a tune they like?
